Show Support for Our Schools SPS FY18 Budget Hearing—December 7 Why This FY18 Budget Hearing Is Important to All of Us

Every year, our Sudbury Public School administration works with our School Committee to present a budget to the Sudbury Finance Committee. This iterative process takes into account guidelines presented by the town's Finance Committee, but also evaluates ***our actual district needs to adequately serve our children and maintain the level of quality education*** our community expects and appreciates.

This year is unlike any other in recent history—***balancing the needs of our district within the budget guidelines dictated by the Finance Committee is not likely possible***. This note provides parents with some background and context for the upcoming budget decision, and asks for your support in advocating for the budget our school needs.

If you want to have your voice heard as important decisions are evaluated, this is your opportunity.

Finance Committee Instructions

For the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year, the Finance Committee has instructed the School Committee to present a budget for SPS that represents a 2.25% increase. At the same time, contractual obligations require a 3.5% increase in compensation for teachers and staff. This means SPS will be required to cut the operating budget unless other alternatives are explored.

SPS Budget Implications

While ***we already spend below state average per student across our district***, this budget cut will involve a diligent review of current spending, and minimize the opportunities SPS has to improve and innovate next year and beyond. Given the severity of the existing budget, every expense will need to be thoroughly assessed, including:

- A continued moratorium on all technology purchases, limiting the ability to improve support in our classrooms.
- Analysis of current fees that may not be sufficient to cover club and other extra-curricular activity expenses.
- Analysis of costs of the one-to-one program at Curtis Middle School, which is currently offered at no cost to families.
- A selective reduction in staffing across schools, as staff compensation and benefits account for 85% of district expenses.

In addition, any budget cut will require a continued “hold” on several needs and improvement areas identified across the district, including but not limited to: additional nursing at the middle school, additional district-wide social worker staff, elementary school science coach, recommendations for special education oversight, and technology support staff.
